I went to the University of Pittsburgh where I got the BS, MS and PhD in electrical engineering.

Then in 1970, I went to Bell Laboratories in Naperville IL. While there I worked on electronic switching machines. While there, I taught evening EE courses at Illinois institute of technology. After 2.5 years I left to go to the University of Toledo as an assistant professor of EE.

After 4.5 years, I went back to industry in 1978 at Motorola here Austin.

This is a setup to give caregivers of people with impairments (Alzheimer's, etc) a day off once a week while those they care for come together for games, music, lunch, music and bingo. Here in Austin there is a volunteer group called "Lifetime Learning Institute" which offers about 80 different courses at very low cost. I regularly do the German class and have also done a memoir writing course.
