THE GENERAL MEETING MINUTES, May 14, 2024

The MAAC general meeting was held at the Austin Recreation Center at 1301 Shoal Creek Blvd. The meeting was called to order at 10:05A.M., by Sandra Lawell.

Speakers: Don McPhee, CFO, Austin Habitat for Humanity, presented on the organization. Key items of note were:

- The local organization serves Bastrop, Blanco, Caldwell, Hays and Travis counties.
- In the last 10 years, the gap between home prices and income has increased dramatically, making home ownership not viable for low and even medium income families in the Austin area.
- Habitat provides new single-family homes, row homes, condos, and town homes.
- Habitat integrates their affordable homes into higher priced home areas to avoid creating "low income project" neighborhoods. Their homes are of equal quality as other homes in the neighborhood, although they may be smaller in square footage.
- Habitat also operates the Restore stores in the Austin area.
- Habitat is significantly funded through Large Affordable Housing Bonds.
- Habitat uses a mix of paid contractor and volunteer labor for construction. Paid contractors are used where safety and code compliance are the drivers. Volunteers (over 8,300 in 2023) are used in other areas of the build.

Don fielded/answered lots of interesting questions during and after the presentation.

Treasurer's Report: Cal Gooden gave the treasury report update. The MAAC total balance is \$8,143.96, a net change of (\$2,588.39) since February, due primarily to the issuance of two \$1,500 scholarship checks during the quarter.

MAAC Picnic Results: Wayne Harned reported on the recent annual MAAC picnic, held on April 16 in Old Settlers Park. The BBQ lunch and desserts (especially the homemade cookies) were great, along with the antique car show and the frisbee, putting, and basketball toss competitions. All went well and there were 37 people in attendance. A special thanks to everyone who helped organize, set up and clean-up to make this year's picnic a success.

<u>Scholarship Fund & Motorola Solutions Foundation Update:</u> Jim Binneboese reported status of the member Scholarship Fund and the Motorola Solutions (Gary Daniels) UT Endowment Fund.

Since 2020, two previous recipients of (\$1,500) scholarships from the member Scholarship Fund have graduated and three new scholarships have been issued in the last two years.

The Motorola Solutions UT Endowment is currently funded at approximately \$44K. Over the last few years, five students have received scholarships (\$800 - \$1200 each). The MAAC is continuing efforts to increase the endowment to \$50K so it can receive enhanced financial status from UT, putting it's ROI on par with UT's very large multi-million dollar investments. MAAC members are encouraged to contribute to help reach the \$50k goal.

Jim met with NXP and discussed the viability of NXP providing a \$10K contribution to the Endowment Fund in the form of matching donations. So far, this is looking promising. Jim also noted that NXP offered the use of a conference room at their Oak Hill campus, for regular MAAC meetings. Jim is also pursuing National Instruments, to see if they might support the Fund as well.

Entertainment: Ray Voith and Mercedes Chung provided live (guitar, harmonica and vocal) entertainment. Songs on the playlist were:

THE BOARD MEETING MINUTES, July 9, 2024

The Zoom meeting was called to order at approximately 10 A.M., by Sandra Lawell. In attendance were: Norm Herr, Jim Binneboese, Wayne Harned, Ray Voith, Danna Redford, Obie Hasty, Sandra Lawell and Roger Wood.

In advance of the meeting, Cal Gooden provided the treasurer's report. Key items addressed at the meeting were:

- Jim Binneboese gave an update on the scholarship funds. He noted the MAAC Scholarship funds are very low and need replenishing. The good news is that NXP has set aside \$5K for the Gary Daniels fund. Jim is also continuing to pursue potential support from Emerson (formerly National Instruments).
- Discussion continued regarding the location of future MAAC meetings.
 - NXP (Oak Hill campus) has offered the use of their facility for MAAC meetings. Sandra Lawell will follow up with them (NXP contact Morgan Teal) to schedule the next MAAC general membership meeting in August, exact date/time TBD. The meeting could possibly include a presentation and tour of the new NXP Smart Home Lab at Oak Hill.
 - It was decided to terminate further discussions with the City of Austin Senior
 Activity Center as the center management has been very uncooperative regarding
 scheduling and use of the facility.
 - It was discussed that future meetings could possibly be rotated between the Austin Recreation Center (central Austin) and NXP Oak Hill campus (southwest Austin).
 Perhaps most of the meetings could be held at the Austin Recreation Center as it is centrally located and more convenient for most attendees.
- Speakers are needed for future general membership meetings. Some ideas included HEB and Engage, an organization that helps place volunteers where they are needed. Additional speaker suggestions will be appreciated.
